## **Backgrounder: What is the Apprenticeship Ratio?**


The apprenticeship ratio sets how many apprentices a certified journeyperson can supervise at one time.

- Under a 2:1 ratio, one journeyperson may train two apprentices.
- Under a 1:1 ratio, that same journeyperson may train only one.

When Manitoba moved to a 1:1 ratio in October 2024, it immediately reduced the number of apprentices employers could hire—limiting entry into the skilled trades.

Most provinces, including Alberta and Saskatchewan, continue to allow 2:1 or more flexible ratios.
